


Figure 5 – Freesound #1295




Figure 6 – Freesound #3084 'Electric Melodies' (freesound.org)




Figure 7 – Freesound #1077 'Artificial Speech' (freesound.org)




Figure 8 – Freesound #1074 'Talking Instruments' (freesound.org)




Figure 9 – Freesound #1091 'Electric Birds' (freesound.org)




Figure 10 – Freesound #8439 'Field Glissandi' (freesound.org)




Figure 11 – Freesound #3053 'Fractaled Noise' (freesound.org)




Figure 12 – Freesound #7198 'Dropped Drops' (freesound.org)




Figure 14 – Freesound #968 'Voice Tracks' (freesound.org)




Figure 15 – Freesound #19688 'Exsamples Passage' (freesound.org)




Figure 16 – Freesound #19745 'Voice Noise Tones' (freesound.org)




Figure 17 – Freesound #19590 'Bell tunes' (freesound.org)




Figure 18 – Freesound #7504 'Repetition Bass' (freesound.org)




Figure 21 - | | | | | | - The Earth - 坤 kūn (YouTube)
